Teacher Presentation (Kathy Larson)	Parenting Podcast - Kathy Larson, 4th grade teacher and certified youth-and-parent life coach, joined the meeting to get feedback on a podcast she is working on focused on parent education

Principal Update (Cindy)	Concerns about Class Sizes Cindy outlined the many considerations for determining class sizes, including classroom space, developmental stages, and curriculum that involves additional teaching support (e.g. 3rd grade Spanish students have an extra teacher in the room when they start learning English). Minnewashta is on track with class size averages across the other schools in the district; however the district annual report misrepresents the actual	

	size of classes this year - Minnewashta has fewer students overall (~916) than we have in years past (previous years have been around 960) - An influx of students to Minnewashta occurred with the housing development at the Minnetonka Country Club. To accommodate, Minnewashta lowered its open enrollment rate. At-Home Learning Days - At-home learning is unlikely to be implemented for elementary students before a third consecutive day of an emergency closure.	
President Update (Sarah S; Laura)	District PTO Leadership Meeting Topics Discussed - School Nutrition – PTO leaders received an informative presentation on school nutrition; key takeaways: - The nutrition team is proud to work with as many local farmers and suppliers as possible - Suppliers rework the nutritional content of key products to meet school nutrition requirements (so a product is better meeting those nutrition requirements than the same product parents are familiar with buying off the shelf at a grocery store) - Parents should contact Jane Bender in nutritional services with further questions - CASE Committee – The parent legislative action committee is looking for parents interested in joining the committee to go to the capital and share talking points and personal stories with legislators.
