## What does win time look like at Deephaven Elementary School?

WIN Time stands for What I Need, also known as a learner-centered approach. Students will benefit from differentiated instruction that occurs during a 30-minute daily WIN time ("what I need") that includes reteaching, remediation, or extension activities for Math, Literacy, and Social Emotional Learning.

**Student Drop-off and Pick-up** to ensure student safety and to reduce the time it takes to get through the process. Please be respectful to our outside staff, as they have been instructed to enforce these procedures.

- 1. Keep in mind that our front parking lot is designed as a two-lane parking lot with one-way traffic.
- 2. **Students need to exit and enter the vehicle on the curb side.** Students entering or exiting a vehicle on the passenger side are in danger of being hit by a car by the second lane of traffic.
- 3. Adults should remain in their car and students should have their backpack and other items ready to go at arrival time. Exceptions are made for assistance with students too young to buckle or unbuckle their car seat.
- 4. **Pull up as far as possible.** Proceed to the stop sign if you have no cars in front of you. Follow the directions given by the outside staff. We need to use our entire sidewalk to allow more students to exit and enter their vehicle.
- 5. **No parking and walking your child into school between 7:30-8:00 a.m.** Exceptions will be made for medical reasons, volunteering, or a meeting with staff. This practice is dangerous and slows down our entire drop-off and pick-up process for everyone in line.

Additional reminders:

- 1. Arrive before 7:40 to avoid the traffic. Buses arrive at 7:45 and traffic begins to back up.
- 2. Students are to be at school at 7:50 to prepare for the start of school at 8:00 a.m.

Our goal is to create a safe and quick process for every parent. Please show consideration to the rest of our school community by following our drop-off and pick-up procedures.

**Bus Corral Area is for Students and Staff** during arrival time and dismissal time. Parents picking up students by car or foot need to meet their child along the front sidewalk or front door. For student safety and school security reasons, we separate our students that take the bus to and from school, from those students that are dropped off or picked up by a parent. **Only adults on staff are allowed in our bus corral area.**
