Thank You, Voters!

Approval of local funding will provide stable finances for years

With 72% approval, Minnetonka School District voters overwhelmingly approved local funding for operations and technology for the next 10 years. "Local funding is an essential component of the way we fund schools in Minnesota," shared Dennis Peterson, "As I have met and talked with various community groups in recent months, it is clear that community members are deeply invested in the success of our students and our schools. Our students are fortunate to have so many adults, beyond parents, who want to support their future success."

Strong schools are essential to a strong community, and recent real estate reports clearly indicate that the Minnetonka School District is a district of choice for families who value a strong community and excellence in education. In September, the average home sale value increased more than 8.4% over September 2014 and the number of home-sales-closed returned to peak pre-recession levels.

School Board Election Two incumbents and two new members were elected to the Minnetonka School Board on November 3: Incumbents Lisa Wagner and Lisa Sumner will extend their service another four years. Newcomers Mark Ambrosen and Katie Becker, parents of Minnetonka students, will also join the Board. Ambrosen and Becker are parents of children attending Minnetonka Schools.

School Board Chair Charlie Kanan and former Chair Karen Walkowski will end their Board service at the end of December.

Prior to being elected to a four-year term, Charlie served on the Minnetonka Public Schools Foundation, the Strategic Planning Team, the Innovation Team, the Community Education Advisory Board and the Minnetonka Diamond Club. A 1969 Minnetonka High School graduate who has lived in many cities around the country, Kanan returned



to Minnetonka to settle down when his son was in school. "My family received so much care and guidance from staff in the Minnetonka Schools, I really wanted to give back as a volunteer and eventually as a Board member." Charlie has often shared stories of teachers and principals who gave him guidance in parenting. "Being on the School Board gave me an even deeper appreciation for how well-run this district is. Dr. Peterson has a vision for excellence and everyone he has



hired is committed to world-class excellence for kids." Charlie's mantra, "give more than you receive," means his volunteer work is just beginning. He continues to serve on the Diamond Club Board, is a member of the Lake Minnetonka Excelsior Rotary Club known for "service before self," and has been a VANTAGE mentor since the program's inception. "It has been a true honor to be of service to this community," Kanan said.

Karen Walkowski served eight years on the Board. Before joining, she was active with the Citizens Finance and Audit Committee and the District Strategic Planning Team. She served as an Action Team Leader and with high school academic and sports programs in which her children were involved. "I remember looking at the finances in 2004



and wondering what would become of the District with a declining enrollment projection and years of budget cuts on the horizon," shared Karen. "Instead, we implemented our Strategic Plan, restructured the budget to be more sustainable, and innovated our way through the recession. We've prudently invested in updating our schools, hired excellent staff, and expanded programs and opportunities for students. I'm proud of all we have done; this is a very different district than what might have been without the strategic decisions that we made." Karen has two adult children, both graduates of Minnetonka High School.

There will be a Farewell Reception for Kanan and Walkowski on Thursday, December 17, from 4-5:30 p.m. at the School District Service Center, 5621 County Road 101, Minnetonka.

The voters in Minnetonka spoke loudly on November 3, expressing their support for two ballot issues for helping fund the schools over the next 10 years. The entire community has stepped up on behalf of their schools and their students. We thank everyone who voted and encouraged others to vote. This is an incredible community and the students benefit from that support every day. The independent committee that ran the campaign worked tirelessly, and members deserve our appreciation as well.

The 71.5% yes vote for the operating levy increase and the 72.8% for continuing the technology levy were great conclusions. The past 10 years have been challenging for districts throughout Minnesota, and only Minnetonka has been able to reach 2015 without major disruptions to funding. This happened, despite the low 1.45% average state aid increase over the past 10 years, because Minnetonka has become powerfully attractive educationally to families throughout the Metro. The enrollment strategy has been a major factor in serving Minnetonka students and keeping property values strong, but we have run out of room for future increases in enrollment.

Congratulations to Katie Becker and Mark Ambrosen on their election to the Board and to Lisa Wagner and Lisa Sumner on their re-election. We will miss Charlie Kanan and Karen Walkowski, but the Board will continue to be strong and visionary.
